## **Jewish Fun**

There is a difference between happiness and goodness. This would explain why in Hebrew we greet each other during the high holy days with *shana tova*, wishing for a year of goodness rather than a year of happiness or fun. When “the pursuit of happiness” becomes the pursuit of fun, life will, of necessity, show a negative balance sheet. The “highs” will always be far shorter than the “lows” in between.

Contrasted to fun is the Jewish concept of *simcha*, joy. Joy is a constant state which derives its sense of connection to something outside ourselves, something eternal, which gives purpose and meaning to life. Of course, we all seek to have fun, be happy and have a good time, but true *simcha* is not a commodity we pursue. Chase it and it eludes us. Authentic Jewish *simcha* is an outgrowth of doing something for somebody. It is the embodiment of goodness.

Rosh Hashanah reminds us that each of us is born incomplete. Our natural tendency is to identify that which is missing from our lives and extend our time and energy to attaining what we feel is missing – material possessions or some physical pleasure. If a person has one hundred dollars, say our sages, he wants two hundred dollars. If he has two hundred, he wants four hundred. For that reason, no man dies with even half his material desires realized.

This reflection shows us why seeking fun is doomed to failure. *Simcha* focuses on our spiritual needs, looking at what is wrong with us: who are we, what are we, why are we here? When we conquer our anger or resist the impulse to speak ill of someone else, or train ourselves to reach into our pockets to give *tzedakah*, deeds of goodness, kindness and generosity – this is real *simcha*. This is Jewish fun: this is authentic happiness.

May each of you, during this New Year, be blessed with the nourishment of your soul and the fulfillment of your spiritual desires and remember – Have Fun!

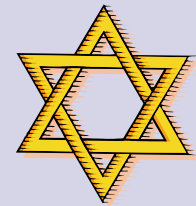

## President's Message

As I start my second year as President, I thought this would be a good time to reflect on my first year, in particular, my first bulletin message. In that message, we listed the administration's mission and goals. The mission: "To position Temple B'nai Sholom to become the leading conservative synagogue on the South Shore." I wrote that to accomplish this mission, we all must work together, communicate and participate in daily shul life – attend services (including morning and evening minyans) and social functions. Before reviewing our five goals, it is important to discuss two unforeseen events that were not on the radar a year ago.

By now you have received my letter dated August 17, 2009 discussing Rabbi Schwartz's retirement. Shortly, you will receive a questionnaire from the Rabbinical Search Committee. It is extremely important that you complete and return the questionnaire as soon as possible. This will help the committee formulate the guidelines needed for selecting our next Rabbi. While many are saddened by Rabbi's retirement, now is not only the time to show Rabbi Schwartz the love and admiration we have for him, but also to show that same love and admiration to our temple and help us continue to secure the future, so that our children have a place to enjoy, worship and have a place to call their religious home. Our track record has been great with selecting Rabbi's, and this time should be no different, but we need your help! If you haven't done so already, please complete the questionnaire today! We are in the process of forming a committee that will be tasked with establishing various events throughout 2010 to pay tribute to Rabbi Schwartz's career with us. In addition, to a change on the pulpit, there has been a dramatic change in the economy. Times are tough, the economy hasn't been good – but the temple (like each of us) has bills to pay. We need to adjust the way we operate in the upcoming year. Please rest assured, dues ARE NOT going up and this is NOT about a dues increase! That said, we need you to change the way you pay your dues and temple bills. Most families, mine included, think of our temple dues as being payable right before the High Holidays. This way of thinking must change. Our bills are consistent throughout the year, and will need a stream of income from the members to keep us current for our day to day expenses. We are revising our billing system to give a due date and provide for an easy way to set up monthly/quarterly payments to your credit card. Please help us and make the necessary adjustments to allow us to keep our operations running as normally as possible in these difficult financial times.

As promised, let's now move to the five goals set a year ago....

1. Membership – We set out to add 18 families to our rolls by June 2010 - unfortunately we fell short. This year we will continue to aim high, as we should have several new families from our Learning Center, who are scheduled to join. Please do not hesitate to reach out to Jewish families in your neighborhood and invite them to attend a service, social event or 92<sup>nd</sup> Street Y simulcast by June 2010.
2. Kol Nidre Appeal – 2008 was a success! We hit our target, and the Board thanks you for your contributions. Personally, I want to thank Bob Edelstein and his team for their hard work and determination in 2008. I am pleased to announce that Bob has graciously agreed to chair the committee again this year. While we all recognize that times are tough, please try to give at a minimum what you gave last year, and if possible a little more. Please realize that this year, maybe more than any other, it is greatly needed and appreciated.
3. Fundraising – 2008 wasn't great. We did not hit our targets. We had four events and a great time was had by all who attended each of them. From a fundraising perspective, however, only two were successful, Casino Night and Bazaar. The other two (Art Auction and the Limited Edition) did not raise the money we hoped for. This year must be better. The committee is planning a December event honoring several long-time B'nai families. Also, as noted above, we will be hosting several events honoring Rabbi Schwartz's tenure here at B'nai. In addition to the traditional fundraising, we also have our Live from the 92<sup>nd</sup> Street Y simulcasts. Subscriptions are available for purchase. 4. Web-site – The transformation from paper to electronic communications at our temple has taken place. Our new web-site has proven to be a useful resource for all that is going on at Temple B'nai Sholom, including a home for our electronic Bulletin. We recently received notice that we have won two Solomon Schechter Awards – **GOLD** Medal for the Bulletin; Silver Medal for the Web-site. We will receive the medals at the United Synagogues International Convention in December.

5. Learning Center – for the first time in a very long time the Learning Center starts the year with over 80 children and a need for classes at every grade level! Thanks to Claudia Lieberman and her staff for bringing life into our 2<sup>nd</sup> floor. In 2010, we are hosting United Synagogue's Keter Torah Honor Society awards program, which acknowledges children from Hebrew Schools in our region.

The 2009-2010 year will be a very exciting one here at B'nai Sholom. From the selection of our next spiritual leader, to reenergizing the building by continuing to add programming and events year round, we invite ALL to get involved! There are plenty of committees and opportunities for you to participate with us. Please become an active Temple B'nai Sholom member. This is your synagogue, please be a part of it! 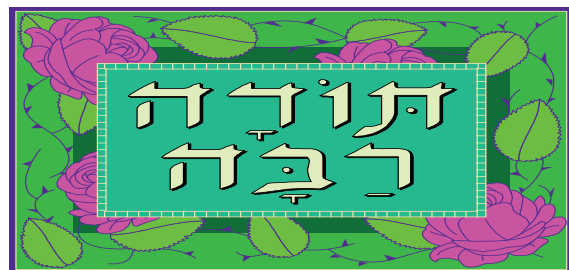
## Sisterhood News

## Learning Center

Ah, Summer Vacation, two wonderful words to an educator. It's a time to recoup and regroup. For those of us in Jewish education, it's a time to sleep in on Sunday mornings and read the Sunday paper (or in my case, watch CBS Sunday Morning with my coffee). Summer usually means less evening meetings, dinners planned, cooked and usually served before 8 pm, reading a few good books for pleasure and taking advantage of all that Long Island has to offer as a summer place: beautiful beaches, great boating, outdoor concerts, and all a mere hop, skip and a jump NYC! And the freedom to do a little traveling to far off places like Alaska and South Carolina is nice too!

BUT, as Educational Director, I also: review and adjust curricula which sometimes requires meeting with teachers and synagogue members; review old and select new textbooks; evaluate and make adjustments of programs from the past year; develop/create new programming for the upcoming year; retrain, recruit or hire faculty; review and make adjustments to the school budget; catch up on reading literature pertaining to the latest trends in synagogue education; prepare schedules, handbooks, curriculum guides, and flyers that will help make for a smooth start in September; and prepare for the opening orientation with faculty, students and parents. And that's just the 'short' of it!

One of the new programs for 2009-2010 will be for the Vov students who are entering their last year of elementary Jewish education and heading for that all-important milestone: Bar/Bat Mitzvah! Although most of our older students are quite comfortable in Jr. Congregation after all these years, they are not as familiar or as comfortable with Shabbat Services in the Main Sanctuary. In an effort to correct that, students in the Vov class will be asked to attend several Shabbat morning services where they will be paired with a synagogue member, sit with them and 'shadow' them during that service. If the member gets an aliyah, the student will follow; if the member has a reading, the student will follow; if the member

sits on the Bima, so will the student; if the member is a gabbai, the student will accompany him and observe the Torah reading. The easy part was coming up with the idea of 'Shabbat Shadows', the challenge is implementing the program. I have asked several people personally if they would be willing to serve as a 'partner' to one or two of our students but I am officially putting the word out here and will gratefully accept volunteers from our TBS Shabbat 'regulars', men and women alike! If you are interested and/or willing to participate in this mitzvah, please contact me. You can do it once or several times, whatever is comfortable for you. I can be reached by leaving a message on the school phone (764-8381) or by email at [clny22@aol.com](mailto:clny22@aol.com).

I am proud to announce that for the first time in my tenure as Director of your Hebrew School we have a complete roster of classes, from Kindergarten through 7th grade, including the addition of the bi-monthly JaMM program for 3 and 4 year olds (thanks to the generosity of Sisterhood). In fact, we had to move computers to the Library so we could have the space back as a classroom! School begins Sunday September 13, 2009 with our usual Parent/Student Orientation and Family Education Morning. Parents come to school with their children, meet the teachers, gather books, learn a lesson together and then enjoy a nosh with their TBS friends after the long summer break. This year the holidays begin right after school starts and fall almost entirely on weekends! Nothing like jumping right into the 'new year', literally and figuratively!

Your support of Torah Fund and the Jewish Theological Seminary ensures the solid and healthy future of Conservative Judaism.

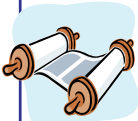


