From the Rabbi's Study:

A New Day

Dr. Barry Dov Schwartz

A New Year....

A New President....

A New Beginning....

More than a billion eyes watched the inauguration of the 44th president of the United States. Americans, whether they voted for him or not, have a right to be proud: America has its first African-American president, and we are witnessing history in the making. This is a rare privilege!

In our Torah portions this month we are reading about Moshe, Moses, our teacher and leader, the first president of the people of Israel. We also read about his brother Aaron and his successor, Joshua. In this light I want to share with you remarks that President Obama delivered at a voting rights march in Selma, Alabama on March 4, 2007. I believe it gives us a deep insight into the man, Barack Obama, and an appreciation of his colossal, seismic achievement. It further illustrates his attachment to, knowledge of, and reverence for our bible:

...I want to talk a little about Moses and Aaron and Joshua, because we are in the presence today of a lot of Moseses. We're in the presence today of giants whose shoulders we stand on, people who battled, not just on behalf of African-Americans but on behalf of all of America; that battled for America's soul, that shed blood, that endured taunts and torment and in some cases gave the full measure of their devotion.

Like Moses, they challenged Pharaoh, the princes, powers who said that some are atop and others are at the bottom, and that's how it's always going to be. And so because of what they endured, because of what they marched; they led a people out of bondage.

I'm here because somebody marched. I'm here because you all sacrificed for me. I stand on the shoulders of giants. I thank the Moses generation; but we've got to remember, now, that Joshua still had a job to do. As great as Moses was, despite all that he did, leading a people out of bondage, he didn't cross over the river to see the Promised Land. God told him your job is done. You'll see it. You'll be at the mountain top and you can see what I've promised. What I've promised to Abraham and Isaac and Jacob...

Mazal Tov, President Obama. Barack in Hebrew means lightning, strength, zeal. May God bless you with a successful presidency, and may you fight with all your strength and vigor for those values so precious and dear in our Judaic and American traditions: freedom, equality, justice and mercy.

Message from the President

Happy New Year! Here's hoping that 2009 brings our congregation all it wishes for. Before we look forward to '09, let's briefly reflect back on 2008 - because it was a very good year for Temple B'nai Sholom.

2008 our first year in our 2nd centennial-concluded the presidency of my good friend Jack Friedman. Since taking over for Jack in June, life at our Temple has been extremely busy. During the summer, our religious committee, Cantor Pevsner and the choir worked hard in preparing for the High Holidays. Thanks again to Rabbi Schwartz for leading our services and making them beautiful. Some other highlights:

In July-we entered into a rental agreement with Stanley Kaplan Educational Testing Services.

In September-our Learning Center welcomed 85 students with a DJ and food, courtesy of Rockville Caterers. This event kicked off the school year on the right foot.

In October-we launched our new website, www.bnaisholom.org. This is the official hub for Temple information. Our calendar is there. You can donate and pay dues. You can read the bulletin. You can submit comments or events you'd like added to the site by using the "Contact Us" link.

In November we held two fundraisers: Our big fundraiser, a Casino Night honoring Mindy and Michael Shenker, welcomed over 160 guests, and turned our ballroom into Monte Carlo. Three weeks later we held our Art Auction and a fun time was had by all.

In December the Learning Center started its JaMM program for 3 and 4 year old children; and we had our annual bazaar, chaired by Steve Koenig. This year's bazaar was very successful, with revenue surpassing the 2007 totals by about 50%. Thanks to all who volunteered their time!

Now 2009--we have high hopes for the coming year. Here is some of what we are planning to accomplish: During the first quarters, we will become the only simulcast site on Long Island's south shore for New York City's 92nd Street Y.

Simply put this means we will be able to watch live from B'nai Sholom, the 92nd Street Y's renowned programming. These programs run the gamut from entertainment to educational to religious. Some possible programs available at B'nai include Jerry Seinfeld, Bill O'Reilly, Al Gore and Salmon Rushdie. These events will be made available to the community and will be run in conjunction with Central Synagogue. Thanks to Irwin Ralph and Marvin Meyers, who brought this great idea to the Board, as well as B'nai B'rith for granting us funding to allow us to purchase the necessary equipment.

By mid-2009 our hope is to go largely paperless. We will be sending flyers by email and they will be available on the website. This also includes our Temple Bulletin. This initiative will allow us to get our message to you in a more timely fashion, as well as reduce the Temple's overall expenses. If you don't have email, please don't worry, you will continue to receive all Temple information in the mail. One paper project that will be completed in 2009 is our new Membership Book. We are collecting data now. Please make sure the Temple office has your updated information

In 2009 we plan on hosting a Blood Drive, as well as numerous fundraisers, including the start of a Capital Campaign to raise funds. We are working on establishing various endowments and naming rights.

Finally, although for the first time since 2005 our dues have gone up, in 2009 we need more than financial support; we need your emotional and physical help. Please commit to attending a morning or evening minyan. Please join a committee. please attend our Congregation Meetings-our next one is in March. Please attend our programming. Temple B'nai Sholom is about more than just paying dues, it is about you and you becoming an active part of your extended Jewish family.


I am pleased to inform you that by a decree signed by the President of the French Republic on October 13, 2008, you have been named a "Chevalier" of the Legion of Honor.

What's new in the Jewish Learning Center? LOTS!

After the fall chagim the school settled down to basic curriculum: Hebrew, Bible and Customs. The next 'big' event on our calendar was "Shabbat l'Mishpacha" or "Shabbat for the Whole Family," scheduled for December 12-13, 2008. We in the school, decided to concentrate on that one holiday that comes EVERY week: SHABBAT. In Music, all the classes learned Shabbat Zmirot, songs to be sung around the Friday night Shabbat table. The Hey Class in particular concentrated on the Havdalah Service which is said on Saturday night at the close of the Sabbath. In Art, the younger classes made Challah Covers while the Hey students made their own Havdalah candles. I am proud to say that 35+ students were present at the first TBS Friday night dinner and they sang beautifully. On Saturday night, students from the Hey class led everyone in Havdalah, under the direction of Cantor Hiesiger. The small chapel was filled with students and their families. After the service, everyone went to Michael's Amusements for an hour of laser tag and video games, a Parents Council Fundraiser. All in all, it was a wonderful weekend of friends, family and Shabbat!

As soon as we were finished with our Shabbat programming, we dove right into Chanukah. All the classes learned the blessings and the proper way to light a Chanukiyah. In fact, many students participated in a Chanukiyah contest where they made their very own Chanukah menorah! They were creative, clever and several of them were even 'green' (made from recycled items!). They were on display in the lobby before the break and I hope you got a chance to see them! Everyone who participated received a box of candles courtesy of Parents Council and Sherut Credit from me. On Sunday December 14th, the halls upstairs smelled and sounded like Chanukah. Between "I Have a Little Dreidle" coming from the music room and the aroma of potato latkes coming from the kitchen, it was evident that Chanukah was right around the corner! Thanks to Parents Council, again, and under the direction of Julie Dickler and friends, all the students were treated to potato latkes and applesauce. And if that was not enough....Danny Zeller, chef extraordinaire, came in on Wednesday before the winter break to 'teach' us how to make the latkes. I, for one, learned a couple of new tricks and if I might say so myself....my latkes were especially good this year!

There is one other piece of exciting news from the Learning Center. On December 7, 2008, we had our first class for 3 and 4 year olds. This program is called JAMM, Judaism, Art, Movement and Music. The class will meet once a month for 90 minutes and it will be an introduction for both students and parents to the Jewish Learning Center. On December 21, 2008, school was closed so the faculty could attend a Yom Iyun, or Faculty Conference. Despite the wintry weather, the teachers all made it out to South Huntington Jewish Center for a morning of different workshops on experiential education. It was both interesting and rewarding. You can expect to see/hear about some new programs/ideas added to our curriculum in the future.

In the classrooms, Aleph and Bet students are learning about their Aleph-Bet, Gimel students are working on the prayer curriculum; Dalet students spend one period a week with Ms. Atlas studying life cycle events, while Hey students go to Mr. Rosenfeld and prepare for the Hidon HaTanach (Bible Contest) in May. Hey is also participating in a 'book club' in the Library. All the students are reading the same book, Alan and Naomi, by Myron Levy and they meet once a week to discuss it. We plan on spending the coming winter months concentrating on curriculum and preparing for the Zimriyah (Regional Song Festival) in March, but anything can happen upstairs when you combine students who want to learn, faculty who want to teach and a love for all that is Jewish so come on up and visit, ANYTIME!

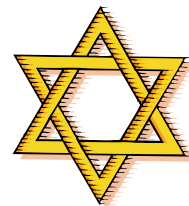
