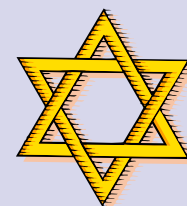

The lit Chanukiyah is placed in the window to show our joy at the survival of our faith.

We praise you, Eternal our God, Ruler of the Universe, for giving us life, for sustaining us, and for enabling us to reach this season.

After reciting the blessings, use the “Shamash” which is lit to kindle the other lights in the menorah. One additional candle is added each night of Chanukah going from right to left. When you light the candles, light them from left to right so the candle for that night is kindled first. On Friday evenings, first light the Chanukah candles and then kindle the Sabbath candles.

Chanukah 5770 commences Friday evening, December 11th and ends with the final candle lighting on Friday, December 18th.

We turned back the clocks recently and our days are getting shorter. Actually, our days are still 24 hours long, still as busy and full as ever, only we have less light. It's kind of fitting that Chanukah comes at this time of year, just when we need it.

Funny thing about the Jewish holidays, Rosh Hashanah comes as summer is waning and a new school year begins. Sukkot arrives as the leaves begin to change and it's time to harvest our crops and prepare for winter. Just as it seems the darkest, we light the Chanukah candles and bring their light and warmth into our lives and homes. When the trees are the barest and there is snow piled all around, along comes Tu B'Shevat and we are forced to 'think spring' and start our seedlings. When winter feels like it might never leave, we dress up in costumes, send gifts of baked goods and treats to friends and family as celebrate the frivolity of Purim. Before we turn around, buds are on the trees, the forsythia is in bloom and we are cleaning our homes in preparation for Passover and the renewal of spring all over again. Then, just as summer is about to burst back on the scene, we are reminded of who we are as Jews as we celebrate Yom HaAtzmaut, Israel Independence Day and later, Shavuot and the giving of the Ten Commandments. Of course, let us not forget or acknowledge our weekly celebration of Shabbat that helps us renew our minds, our bodies and our spirits every 7 days. There are more minor holidays and commemorations in between all of those mentioned that keep our Jewish lives full and busy all year long.

We, in the Hebrew school have begun this year-long journey of learning and are right in the 'thick' of it as school finally settles into a rhythm, which is guided by that calendar. Thanks to several of our Hebrew School graduates, Alex and Max Koenig, Hayley Cohen and Hannah Goldstein, for their help at High Holiday Jr. Congregation this year. Thanks to Cheryl Koenig, Ilene Strobing, Marla Goldberg, Julie Dickler, Elissa Skolnick, Julie Sterenberg and Cindy Kufeld for helping us decorate the Sukkah. It was a sight to behold (before the wind blew it down) filled with beautiful posters of the Ushpuzin (Sukkot guests) as created by the Hey students, lots of streamers, stars, fruits and other decorations, all made by our

students.

Rabbi often calls up on a Wednesday afternoon to invite a class to his study for a visit. The session is an open discussion of anything the students want to talk about. During the year, the teachers gather 'Questions for the Rabbi' so they are ready to go at a moment's notice. Their questions are priceless and Rabbi answers them with patience and love every time.

I am particularly proud of our Bar/Bat Mitzvah Class who participated in the first ever 'Shabbat Shadow' program. On the second day of Sukkot, students from the Vov class came to services in the main sanctuary. They each had their own lulav and etrog and were paired up with a 'shabbat regular' during the service. I wrote about this in last month's bulletin and must thank all those who volunteered to participate: Will Sklar, Sheldon Grossman, Steve Lander, Ira Salwen, Jane Scherer, Al Weiser and Marty Greenberg. The students thoroughly enjoyed the experience and I hope the congregants did too. Lasting memories were created that morning, in addition to making our young people feel 'at home' and comfortable in the main Shabbat service, something so important at this time, pre-Bar/Bat Mitzvah. 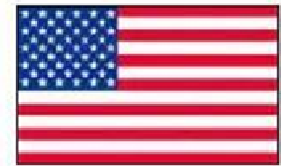

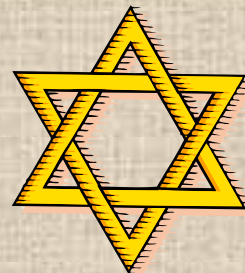
